8. SEDATION AND MONITORING

The drugs and techniques used to provide conscious sedation should carry a margin of safety wide enough to render loss of consciousness unlikely"1 There are two recent key guidelines for sedation and monitoring The British Society of Gastroenterology (BSG) guidelines 'Safety and sedation during endoscopic procedures'2 and the Academy of
